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# YOU HAVE A RESURRECTION COMING!

## I. Resurrection

- A. Resurrection (defined) – Rising, to come “out of” or “removed from,” resurrection from the dead.
- B. **Philippians 3:10** – That I may know Him and the power of His resurrection that lifts me out from among the dead.
  - 1. A spiritual resurrection, not a physical one
- C. **Romans 8:11** – If the same Spirit that raised Christ from the dead dwells in you, He shall quicken your mortal bodies.
  - 1. This is speaking of physical resurrection from sickness or after death.
- D. **Ezekiel 37:1-10** – A pattern to follow for resurrection
  - 1. To experience resurrection, you must first have a serious problem! **How many here qualify?**
  - 2. You must believe that God is greater than your problem.
  - 3. Begin exalting the Word of God over your problem.
  - 4. Be willing to keep applying godly principles – even if you do not see an immediate breakthrough.

**II Kings 4:8-36** – Elisha kept applying the anointing until the boy had a resurrection.

## II. Areas That May Need Resurrection

### A. Ephesians 4:23 – Attitude

1. We will not experience resurrection in our circumstances until we experience resurrection in our attitude toward the circumstances.
2. Psalm 42:5 – Why so downcast, O my soul? Put your hope in God.
3. Colossians 3:1 (KJV) – *If ye then be **risen** with Christ, seek those things which are above . . .*

Resurrection life requires resurrection thoughts.  
We cannot dwell continually on the problem and experience resurrection.

### B. Resurrected out of “dead works”

1. Our fleshly plans and efforts that have no anointing from God upon them
2. Hebrews 6:1; 9:14
3. Ephesians 2:8-9 – A pattern for salvation which includes more than initial salvation

### C. Resurrected from a sinful lifestyle or sin in some specific area

1. Ephesians 2:1, 5-6 – Believe it is a fact established in the spiritual realm, then apply it in your daily life.
2. Romans 5:10 – We can experience daily deliverance from sin.
3. Romans: Chapter 6 is a good chapter to read to encourage yourself concerning being dead to sin.

4. **Luke 15:24** – The prodigal son had a resurrection – he got resurrected out of a pigpen lifestyle.
- D. **Acts 23:8** – Sadducees do not believe in the resurrection.
1. Therefore, they are SAD-U-SEE!
  2. Without hope of resurrection, depression and despair will rule us.

### III. Resurrection In Your Circumstances

- A. Marriage or other relationships, finances, health, your ministry, mind, emotions, etc.
- B. Before resurrection comes: the Garden of Gethsemane, the road to Golgotha, the cross, the grave, and hell.

C. **Luke 22:39-48** – The Garden of Gethsemane

1. Jesus experienced disappointment from His friends.
2. Betrayal
3. Loneliness
4. A major war between His flesh and His spirit
5. Tremendous agony of mind – which I believe included confusion, attacks of fear, etc.
6. I also believe heaven may have been silent during this time.

Many times when we feel we need to hear from God the most, He seems to be the quietest.

- D. The road to Golgotha – Jesus began to carry His cross, and He fell down under the weight of it.

1. Sometimes we fall down under the weight of our problem – we find it hard to be strong all the time.
2. **Luke 23:26** – Simon of Cyrene was assigned to help carry Jesus’ cross. Thank God for the friends and intercessors who help us when we fail.
3. Don’t feel like you have a lack of faith if you cannot always be strong.

E. The Crucifixion and suffering on the Cross

1. See **Luke: Chapters 22-23** and **Matthew: Chapters 26-27**.
2. He felt forsaken by God.
3. He suffered ridicule and great disrespect, but He continued to do what was right.
4. He forgave His crucifiers.
5. He totally placed Himself in God’s hands no matter what happened: “Father, into Your hands I commit My spirit!”

F. **Acts 2:23-31** – David prophesied concerning the Resurrection. Jesus knew deep inside that His Father would not leave Him in hell.

G. We must go to the grave of our own hopes and dreams sometimes.

1. We must die to the very thing we believe for and decide to love God just as much if we never get it.

H. Sometimes we feel as if we are in hell.

I. But we have a resurrection coming!!

#### IV. Sunday Morning

A. **Matthew 28:1-6** – He is risen!

- B. **Micah 7:8** – *Rejoice not against me, O my enemy! When I fall, I shall arise; when I sit in darkness, the Lord shall be a light to me.*
- C. **Genesis 13:14-17** – Abraham was told to ARISE and get a new vision.
- D. **Joshua 1:2** – Moses is dead. So ARISE (take his place), go over this Jordan into the land that I am giving you.
- E. **Isaiah 60:1** – *Arise [from the depression and prostration in which circumstances have kept you – rise to a new life]! Shine (be radiant with the glory of the Lord), for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you!*
